

News in New Town Plaza

For many years, residents were able to enjoy the musical fountain on level 3 of New Town Plaza, which was dismantled some time ago to make way for improvement works. For those who miss the fountain, we have good news – it's back, up on the level 7 podium area.

The podium garden area is open from 2.30pm to 5pm daily and the fountain shows are scheduled for the following times:

Mon-Fri Sat, Sun and Public Holidays 2.45pm and 4.45pm 2.45pm, 3.45pm and 4.45pm

The podium has been pleasantly designed, with shaded patio sets, benches and wrought iron swing sets – already a hit with the children. In keeping with its new theme as a "Starry Garden", the trees are bedecked with golden stars that catch and reflect the sunlight.

All-in-all, it is a relaxing place for a brief shopping-break. I only have two complaints: first, it is very hot up there if you are not under one of the parasols. Second, the management have a no food and drink rule – a real shame as it would be a get place for a drink and light snack. I have suggested they introduce a small snacks and drinks kiosk to the area and await their response. Meanwhile, enjoy the free show and take your visitors.









Children's Page Extra – Three Museums in one day!

Hong Kong people are famous for packing a lot of action into a short time period, so for those of you who like an action-packed day out, try visiting



three of Hong Kong's Museums in one day – just remember to take your running shoes with you! Conveniently located in Tsim Sha Tsui and within walking (or running) distance of each other, here is just a taste of what they have to offer....

First, visit the Hong Kong Museum of History's "Hong Kong Story" to experience some of Hong Kong's past and the events and people who have made Hong Kong what it is today – and don't forget to check out the Double Decker tram in the middle of the exhibition gallery! Great value at only \$10 for adults and \$5 for children.

Follow this with something a little more "hands-on" at the Science museum, where playing with the exhibits is positively encouraged. Everything from space ships to flushing toilets is up for grabs, so get busy!

If you have the time and energy, finish up with a trip to the Space Museum and learn about space travel and galaxies far away. They even have a science-fiction section. The new Omnivax show, Mystery of the Nile, starts on April 1st. (Note for parents – children under the age of 3 are not admitted to the Omnivax show).

For parents who prefer a more leisurely approach to museum visiting, take the museums a day at a time and wander slowly through their worlds of history, science and space. To plan your visits, the following websites may be useful:


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

Arts Calendar

Ching Ming and Easter holidays aren't just for family and religious celebrations; don't miss The *30th Hong Kong International Film Festival,* which takes place from 4-19 April. Complete catalogue listings are available at all URBTIX outlets; counter booking is now available. The films are shown at various venues, including UA Cinemas at Langham Place and Times Square, City Hall, Cultural Centre, HK Arts Centre and HK Film Archives. With so many choices and showings, it's fun to have the catalogue in hand and try to find one that fits your schedule. This year's categories include "Master Class" (famous film directors' works), "Global Vision" (from around the world), "A Tribute to Action Choreographers" (a tribute to Hong Kong's martial arts films and one of

my favourites!) as well as world premiers and awards ceremonies. When you're out and about, it's good to know about a few places where you can grab a bite to eat between movies. Here are a few of my favourites:

The Museum Cafe, located near the Art Museum at TST's Cultural Centre, is a fantastic little place with *al fresco* dining, great views of the harbour, and wonderful food.

Pumpernickel, located in the HK Arts Centre (3rd floor) in Wan Chai, is a great little café, again with views of the harbour. They serve tasty sandwiches, pastries, and coffee.

Maxim's, located in City Hall has three different options for eating: a ground-floor cafe/bar, a 2nd floor Western-style restaurant and the famous Cantonese restaurant on the top floor with views of the harbour and long queues for dim sum at lunch!
